### **THE J. PAUL GETTY MUSEUM PRESENTS COLLEGE NIGHT AT THE GETTY CENTER**


*Special tours, hands-on art projects, music by Mystery Skulls and Rivoah, and much more!*

LOS ANGELES—The J. Paul Getty Museum will host its annual College Night on Monday, April 7, 2014, from 6:00–9:30 p.m. at the Getty Center. Local college students are invited to enjoy a night of special tours, live music, hands-on art projects, scavenger hunts and more. This year, College Night celebrates the exhibitions [\*A Royal Passion: Queen Victoria and Photography\*](#) and [\*Jackson Pollock's Mural\*](#). Best of all, parking and admission to College Night are free!



#### **Tours, Workshops, and Other Activities**

Students can enjoy an evening jam-packed with opportunities to view exhibitions and let their creativity shine. They will get exclusive access to Pollock's storied *Mural* and a behind-the-scenes exploration of the conservation process. Students can also connect with Queen Victoria through dozens of photographs and artifacts, tracing both her royal life and the concurrent development of photography.

For a more hands-on experience, students can practice their drawing skills with artists Marissa Magdanela and Helen Gu in conjunction with the exhibition [Hatched! Creating Form with Line](#), or make a contribution to a digital graffiti wall inspired by Pollock.

If a group is feeling restless, a museum-wide scavenger hunt offers a chance to explore the collection in a unique way and win prizes. But they'll have to watch out for actors donning Victorian dress and strolling through the halls!



**Music + Food + Drink + Etc.**

In between exhibitions, students can enjoy the music of [Mystery Skulls](#) and [Rivoah](#) throughout the evening. There will also be free food and a cash bar. For a lasting memento of their evening, students can have their picture taken at an on-site photo booth or strike a [#VictorianPose](#) at a station outside the museum entrance.



The exhibitions [Hiroshi Sugimoto: Past Tense](#) and [In Focus: Ansel Adams](#) will also be on view throughout the evening. Permanent exhibition galleries in South and West Pavilions will also be open.

#### **Visiting the Getty Center**

The Getty Center is open Tuesday through Friday and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. It is closed Monday and major holidays. Admission to the Getty Center is always free. Parking is \$15 per car, but reduced to \$10 after 5 p.m. on Saturdays and for evening events throughout the week. No reservation is required for parking or general admission. Reservations are required for event seating and groups of 15 or more. Please call (310) 440-7300 (English or Spanish) for reservations and information. The TTY line for callers who are deaf or hearing impaired is (310) 440-7305. The Getty Center is at 1200 Getty Center Drive, Los Angeles, California.

#### **Visiting the Getty Villa**

The Getty Villa is open Wednesday through Monday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., with special Saturday hours until 9 p.m. October 12–December 7, 2013. It is closed Tuesday and major holidays. Admission to the Getty Villa is always free. A ticket is required for admission. Tickets can be ordered in advance, or on the day of your visit, at [www.getty.edu/visit](http://www.getty.edu/visit) or at (310) 440-7300. Parking is \$15 per car. Groups of 15 or more must make reservations by phone. For more information, call (310) 440-7300 (English or Spanish); (310) 440-7305 (TTY line for the deaf or hearing impaired). The Getty Villa is at 17985 Pacific Coast Highway, Pacific Palisades, California.

Same day parking at both Museum locations (Getty Center and Getty Villa) is available for \$15 through the Getty's Pay Once, Park Twice program.
